


Overview

The adapter set (SIM002) for mounting the Simplex attendant control is designed to be as flexible as possible. This means that you have the flexibility to mount the bracket in different ways to achieve the desired position. It's a good idea to test different options before making the final decision.

This adapter set can be mounted on a wheelchair where the distance between the attachment points is up to 510 mm. If a wider fastener is required, please refer to the accessories described in section *Extension kit* on page 8 of this assembly instruction.

In most cases, the Simplex should be mounted horizontally. Make sure to place the rear part of the Simplex close to perpendicular to the ground level, as in the image below.






The Simplex handle is not intended for lifting or pushing down when taking obstacles. If necessary, move one or both hands to the wheelchair's regular handles.

Basic design

Start by getting familiar with the adapter set and go through the different components as follows.







The universal adapter set allows for a variety of mounting options for Simplex, providing flexibility in the installation process.

Illustration of the installation against the lower part of the wheelchair's push handles. For best results, mount on stable attachment points.



How the arms connect to the Simplex mounting plate.






Illustration of mounting against the upper part of the wheelchair's push handle, next to the grip surface.

Extension kit

When the width of the universal adapter set is insufficient, an additional accessory with item number (SIM003) is available (ordered separately). This article allows installation where the distance between the attachment points is up to 600 mm.




Illustration with extension kit mounted.







Illustration of Simplex assembled with extension kit.

Cabling

Now fasten the Simplex cable harness with cable ties so that it cannot get caught in moving parts or external obstacles.

Tightening Torques

Unless otherwise specified, use the following tightening torques.

Metric coarse threads, steel.

Thread	Torque
M3	1.2 Nm
M4	3 Nm
M5	6 Nm
M6	10 Nm
M8	25 Nm
M10	50 Nm
M12	85 Nm



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
